At the final hearing, the Drainage Authority will hear and consider the viewers' report. All persons interested in the redetermination of benefits and damages and benefited and damaged areas of Judicial Ditch 18 Brown and Redwood County are invited to appear and be heard by and before the Joint Drainage Authority of Brown County & Redwood County, at that time, for or against the proposed proceeding and with respect to any other matters in connection with it.

Judicial Ditch 18 Brown and Redwood provides drainage to portions of Sections 8, 9, 16, 17, 18, 19 & 30 of Eden Township in Brown County, and Sections 13, 14, 22, 23, 24, 25, & 26 of Morgan Township in Redwood County.
