

COUNTY SURVEYOR

Christian Ludwig Meyer, the man who headed the first group of settlers to arrive from Chicago in 1854, was among those appointed by Governor Gorman to constitute the first corps of officials of the new County of Brown. He was given the post of County Surveyor on March 8, 1856, and in October of the same year he was elected by the voters of the County to fill the same position. After the first year of his term he gave way to Christian Prignitz, who served throughout 1858.
